**About Budapest** Budapest, the capital of Hungary is one of the most exciting cultural and touristic centres in the heart of the Middle-European region. Budapest, has a longstanding tradition as a centre of science and culture. The city was created by the unification of Buda and Óbuda on the hilly west bank of the Danube and Pest on the flat east bank in 1873. Today Budapest has 1.8 M inhabitants and on the Buda side the Castle District with the Royal Palace and the Matthias Church, as well as the Gellért Hill with the Citadel are among the holders of the prestigious World Heritage Award. Budapest is a perfect meeting point that will leave treasured and lasting memories.

**How to get there** You arrive at Ferihegy Airport in Budapest, Hungary.

From Ferihegy Airport you can take a taxi (30 minutes, costs about 25 EUR) or public transportation.

At Ferihegy Airport take bus **200E**. Get off the bus at: **Kőbánya-Kispest** (last stop of the bus). Follow the signs M3. Take the metro **M3**. Get off the metro at: **Ferenc körút** (7 stops). At Ferenc körút follow the sign **4-6 villamos Margit híd**. Take the tram 4 or 6 towards Margit híd. Get off the tram at **Baross utca** (only 1 stop).

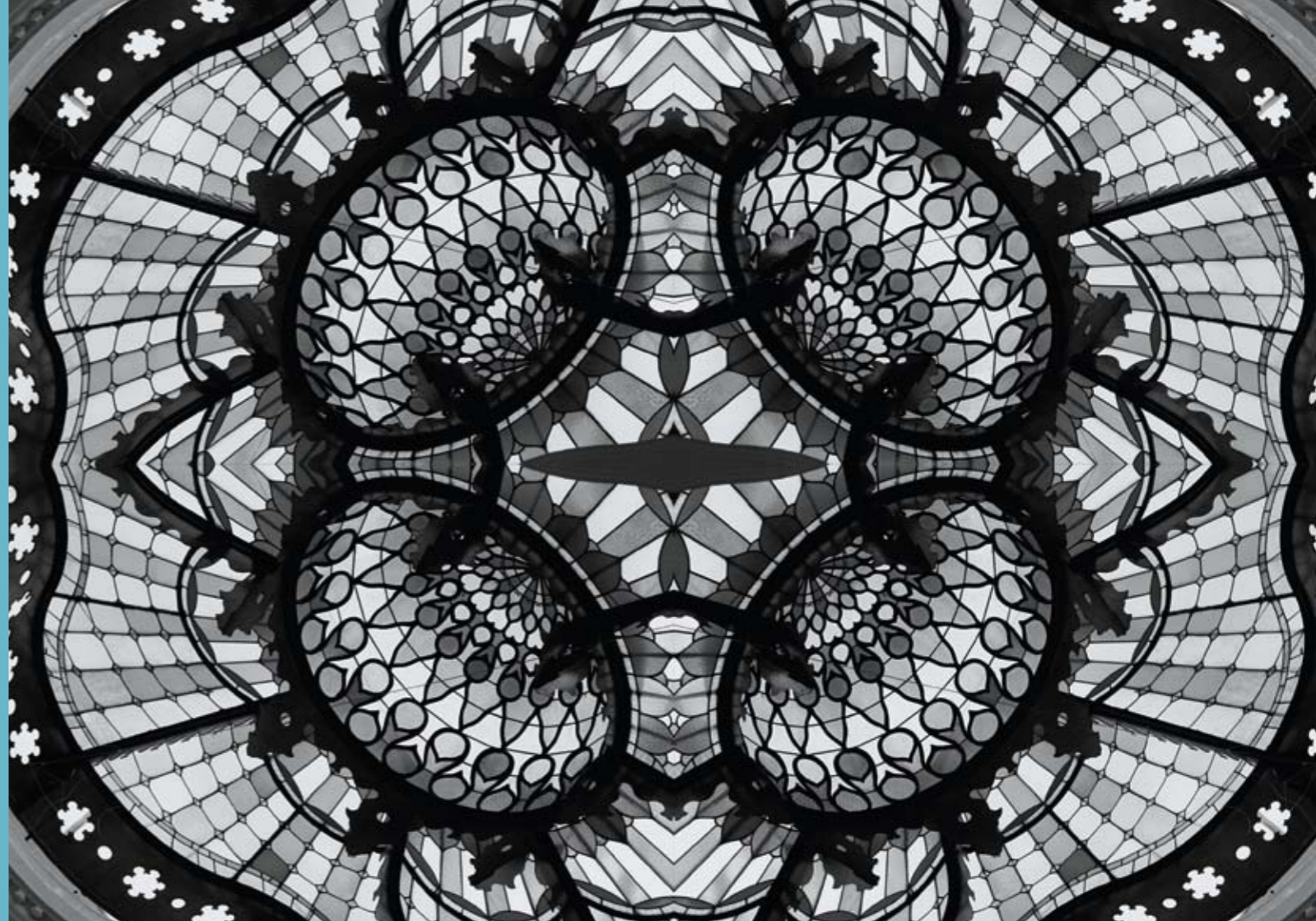
